




LAYOUT





Part I: Dim Sum Dining

Within the surrounding forest, the Dim Sum parlor is located in a quadrangle shaped building within the tall, well-lit indoor environment, modeled after the traditional Chinese architectural style, 四合院 (Siheyuan), which includes an inner courtyard surrounded by rooms. Tian Tang Dim Sum merges this cultural architectural style with the playfulness of modern game aesthetics, especially RPG and 2D pixel art.



Your team has a choice of dining in a <u>private room</u> with an elegant view of the gardens, or a <u>community dining space</u>! In a private room, you order food via communicating with a waiter, and in the community space, food is distributed by carts with stacks of bamboo steamers of fresh dim sum! Both seating arrangements will allow you and your team to savor the food and make plans for your next adventures!





In both communal and private dining rooms, you and your teammates have access to a circular table with a Lazy Susan for serving food. Each person will have a placemat (designed to look like an RPG inventory) with specialized dim sum utensils. In private dining, food is typically served within 5-15 minutes after ordering, while communal diners can receive their food immediately as the dim sum cart wheels around.






Part II: Performances

To build a culture of community, we encourage you, travelers, to participate in our collaborative theatrical performances. Next to the Dim Sum Parlour is a circular stage performance area. Rather than simply sitting back to watch a performance, you are invited to be part of the action! No experience is necessary; all of our performers are here to guide you, your team, and the greater community towards achieving peace and mutual understanding.

Part III: Forest Quests - Interactive & Immersive Adventures



Heaven's Password: To help Kai reopen the gates to heaven, guests must scavenge the forest for hints and uncover the password before the spirits become displeased.



Lotus Quest: To let the water spirit, Jin, restore balance to earth and water, guests must locate all 12 lotus blossoms scattered in the forest by a violent windstorm.



Forest Spirit: Guests must collaborate and trust each other to revitalize the forest spirit, who is afraid of human violence and has vanished since the wars.

The Tian Tang Forest, located right outside of the Dim Sum parlor, carries many secrets of its own. Heroes, are you ready to embark in your own little side quest through the forest? You have three options to choose from: 天堂密码 (Heaven's Passcode), 莲花寻求 (The Lotus Quest), and 森林幽灵 (The Forest Spirit). Heaven's Password and The Lotus Quest are both individual quests, while The Forest Spirit is a team quest (3-6 people). Each quest lasts for an hour, and different parties may play the same quest at the same time. While the quests are not designed to be competitive between parties, the first parties to complete each quest during a designated quest period receive bragging rights and an exclusive quest badge.

Characters







A lake spirit in the form of a goldfish that regulates the balance of earth and water through her lotus blossoms.



FENG

A mysterious, young, and timid forest spirit that takes the form of a baby dragon and hides from violence.

KAI

A mischievous but kind jade guardian lion who has part-time jobs of guarding the gates to heaven and running the dim sum parlor.



Forest Quests [cont'd]

天堂密码/ Heaven's Password Script Sample:

The game starts. Guests look at their tablets and see Kai, the guardian lion, introduce their mission.

Kai: Thank you for agreeing to the quest! I am in desperate help. The battle last night shut the gates to Heaven, and I am responsible for opening the doors. (whispers) Don't tell anyone this, but I forgot the password and it's somewhere in the forest. If I don't reopen it soon, people are going to stop coming for Dim Sum!


Guest: Oh no! How can I help?

Kai: Luckily, my line of ancestors left the password coded in the forest. The guardian lion statue near the caves should hold some clues! Good luck!

The tablet indicates to 'Find the Lion Statue.'

Guests may check the map to see where the caves are, and proceed.

Guests play the forest quests via RFID tags and tablets that track their progress in real time.
